About the Artists

Bradley Norris has served as Minister of Music at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Newport News since 1986, and has taught third, fourth, and fifth grade music and has directed the school chorus at St. Andrew's School since 2002. He holds degrees in organ performance from the University of Wisconsin-Superior and the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati. He is active as an accompanist in the Hampton Roads area. Some of his choral anthems have been published by Augsburg Fortress.

Jocelyn Smith grew up in Albuquerque, New Mexico, where she began string and piano studies at the age of nine. She earned her Bachelor of Music degree in viola performance from the Cleveland Institute of Music, where she studied with Chauncey Patterson, former violist of the Miami String Quartet, and Lisa Boyko of the Cleveland Orchestra. Ms. Smith is currently is a longtime member of the Virginia Symphony Orchestra. She is also a founding member, along with husband and cellist Peter Greydanus and violinist Tara-Louise Montour, of the Clivia String Trio, which was named Performing Artists of the Year by Young Audiences of Virginia in 2008. She lives in Norfolk with her husband Peter, their daughters Mirabelle and E da, and their cat Lily.
